Things to Do in Mequon, Wisconsin

Mequon is known for its majestic bluffs, stately homes, lush farmland and expansive open space. The community enjoys many parks, five golf courses, the winding Milwaukee River and easy access to the interstate for a convenient commute to Milwaukee.

Ozaukee County Trail

The Ozaukee Interurban is a 30-mile paved trail that spans the entire length of Ozaukee County. The majority of the Trail is off-road and perfect for family enjoyment. The Trail connects the Ozaukee communities of Mequon, Thiensville, Cedarburg, Grafton, Port Washington and Belgium. It runs along woodlands, wetlands, farmlands and waterways, including the Milwaukee River, Lake Michigan and the Lake Michigan National Marine Sanctuary, and provides easy access to Ozaukee County's walkable downtowns.











Schlitz Audubon Mature Center

Located in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, our mission is to conserve our land's diverse habitats on Lake Michigan and provide meaningful experiences and environmental education for all. This 185-acre habitat sits on Lake Michigan with 6 miles of hiking trails & a 60-ft. observation tower.

Jynden Sculpture Garden

The Lynden Sculpture Garden offers a unique experience of art in nature through its collection of more than 50 monumental sculptures sited across 40 acres of park, lake and woodland.





Thiensville Farmers Warket

The Thiensville Farmers Market has so many great vendors and never disappoints. Check them out Tuesdays during the summer!

Things to Do in Cedarburg, Wisconsin

Cedarburg, Wisconsin is a charming town full of nostalgia only 20 miles north of Milwaukee. The quaint downtown is full of boutiques, restaurants, historic inns, and cultural attractions all surrounded by pristine landscapes along the enchanting Cedar Creek. The storybook atmosphere is present throughout the community where tree-lined streets border limestone buildings in one of America's favorite small towns. Certain attractions may be temporarily closed or require advance reservations. Some restaurants are currently offering pickup only. Hours/availability may have changed.

Cedar Creek Winery

Cedar Creek Winery is an award-winning and family-owned winery that began as a woolen mill in 1864. The mill was open for 105 years before closing after synthetic fabrics became popular. A local winemaker purchased the mill in 1972 and redesigned the property into a winery famous for cherry wines. Today, the wines are grape-focused and barrel-aged in stone wine cellars. Tours and tastings are available daily on the main floor. A wine shop is on site where guests can take home bottles of award-winning blush, white, and red grape wines.



Wisconsin Wuseum of Quilts and Fiber Arts

Founded by quilters as The Wisconsin Quilt Project Inc in 1988 with a mission to preserve the creativity and history of quilting. The museum currently has more than 8,000 quilts, each with a particular story, and is located in the Hoffman-Boeker farmstead. There are typically artists exhibitions, workshops for children and adults, classes, lectures, lunches with artists, special events, and fundraisers.

Cedarburg Art Museum

The Cedarburg Art Museum is a historic residence dating back to 1898 and features beautiful red brick showcasing several architectural styles including Romanesque, Classical, and Queen Anne. Visitors to the museum still walk on the original oak floors underneath hand painted canvas ceilings that have been preserved beautifully. Much of the original stained glass also remains with views overlooking the historic district of Cedarburg.



Cedarburg Creek Farm

A giant pumpkin farm offering great family activities in the summer and early fall. The family-owned farm features free hayrides, a petting zoo with free admission, bounce house, barrel train, corn maze, and other family entertainment. The property is host to several Farm Festivals every season showcasing live musical performers, singing impersonators, and family-friendly entertainment. Guests can also enjoy picking their own pumpkin to take home, harvesting a Christmas tree, or purchasing fall flowers and décor from the onsite shop.





Stilt House

The Stilt House is an iconic restaurant and brewery featuring a second story that is raised on stilts. The property was raised on stilts in 1900 when a clever tavern owner found a way around the city's denial of his application for a permit to add a second floor to his bar. The current restaurant and brewery opened in 2013 and features craft beers, wine, and small plates. There is a rotating selection of draft beers as well as special "secret stash" offerings, more than 30 wines, and dozens of bottled beers to choose from. The menu offerings feature small plates and full meals.

Cedarburg History Museum

At the Cedarburg History Museum you can take a nostalgic trip back in time as you admire an impressive collection of artifacts and memorabilia which document the history of Cedarburg and Ozaukee County. The museum is housed in the historic Hilgen and Schroeder Mill Store in the heart of historic downtown Cedarburg, where it shares its premises with the local Visitor's Center. The museum is home to permanent exhibitions such as the Port Washington State Bank General Store Museum and also presents rotating temporary exhibitions to showcase important historic aspects of the town and county.





Cedarcreek Settlement

Located in Cedarburg's Washington Avenue Historic District, Cedarcreek Settlement is comprised of shops, restaurants and a winery, located within 5 historic buildings which date to the mid 19th century. Here you will find a variety of interesting one-off shops offering new and vintage clothing, art, pottery, jewelry, olive oil products and much more. The settlement is also home to a winery, 2 craft breweries, a café and two restaurants. The center really comes alive in the weeks leading up to Christmas when lively entertainment is laid on for shoppers each Friday, including live music, festive cookie decorating, wine and food sampling and gift draws.

Cedarburg Performing Arts Center

Since their founding in 1999 the Cedarburg PAC has been bringing a quality performing arts season to Ozaukee County. They are on a constant mission to educate the general public, and especially the youth of Ozaukee County, about the joys of watching and participating in life theatre productions. Every season sees a New Visiting Artists Program which brings top-class out-of-town entertainers to Cedarburg to stage live shows in their small and intimate theatre which is so conducive to audience appreciation and participation. Master classes and workshops are presented to further expose young viewers to the magic of live performance art.

CHARLES ALLIS ART MUSEUM

Listed on the National Register of Historic Places, the lavish 1911 home of Charles and Sarah Allis contains an art collection that includes 19th century French and American paintings, classic antiquities, Renaissance bronzes, Asian ceramics and decorative arts.

GROHMANN MUSEUM

Home to the world's most comprehensive art collection dedicated to the evolution of human work, the museum includes more than 1,400 paintings, sculptures and works on paper from 1580 to the present.

HAGGERTY MUSEUM OF ART

Located on the Marquette University campus, the museum features two floors and a permanent collection that includes European and American contemporary art, Old Master paintings and photography.

LYNDEN SCULPTURE GARDEN

Offers an experience of art in nature through its collection of more than 50 monumental outdoor sculptures sited across 40 acres of park, lake & woodland.

MILWAUKEE ART MUSEUM (MAM)

Part of a 340,000-square-foot complex that includes MAM, the War Memorial Center, The Kahler Building and the Quadracci Pavilion, created by Spanish architect Santiago Calatrava. The museum's holdings include nearly 30,000 works spanning antiquity to the present day, with strengths in 19th and 20th century American and European art, contemporary art, American decorative arts, and folk and self-taught art.

RACINE ART MUSEUM (RAM)

Award-winning architecture houses one of America's largest contemporary craft collections with more than 9,500 objects from nationally and internationally recognized artists in a variety of media. Studio art classes and workshops.

RAM'S WUSTUM MUSEUM OF FINE ARTS

Highlights exhibitions of important regional and local artists. One of the largest studio art programs of any Wisconsin museum.

VILLA TERRACE DECORATIVE ARTS MUSEUM

Overlooking Lake Michigan in a 1923 Italian Renaissance-style villa, the museum features fine and decorative arts from the 15th through 18th centuries, wrought-iron masterpieces by Cyril Colnik, a formal garden and changing exhibits.







General Interest Museums

BETTY BRINN CHILDREN'S MUSEUM

The Milwaukee area's only museum designed specifically for children ages 10 and younger, where children and grown-ups learn alongside each other. Features hands-on exhibits, educational programs, events and performances.

<u>DISCOVERY WORLD SCIENCE + TECHNOLOGY CENTER</u>

Milwaukee's premiere science and technology center that offers fun and learning for the whole family. Explore interactive exhibits, the Reiman Aquarium, eight learning labs, educational programs, and summer learning experiences aboard the S/V Denis Sullivan – a 137-foot recreation of a 19th-century Great Lakes cargo schooner.

HARLEY-DAVIDSON MUSEUM

Offers a glimpse of American history and culture through the successes and trials of an iconic American company started in a Milwaukee garage.

MILWAUKEE PUBLIC MUSEUM

Life-size dioramas, hands-on experiences, and traveling special exhibits. Travel back more than 65 million years to the land of dinosaurs. Gaze at ancient civilizations and see real mummies. Surround yourself with the sound and feel of the tropical rainforest. Walk the "Streets of Old Milwaukee" to experience the city as it was at the turn of the 19th century. Watch a butterfly wriggle out of its chrysalis in a two-story butterfly vivarium. Daily tours, special events and cultural programming.

THE DANIEL M. SOREF DOME THEATER & PLANETARIUM

Offers visitors three unique visual experiences: 3D films, planetarium programs and screen shows on a six-story-tall screen with digital surround sound.

SPINNING TOP & YO-YO MUSEUM

Features 35 hands-on toy tops and top games; a 2,000 item exhibit of tops, yo-yos, and gyroscopes from around the world; plus a live presentation by a top expert. Events include Annual Yo-Yo & Skill Toy Convention, Yo-Yo Summer Day Camp, and gyroscope contest.

WAR MEMORIAL CENTER

Stunning architectural landmark on Milwaukee's lakefront stands as a memorial to those who died in service, served and are currently serving in the U.S. Armed Services. Original World War I and World War II poster collection, eternal flame and reflecting pool, Purple Heart Memorial, 9/11 Memorial and Fox Company Memorial.

WISCONSIN AUTOMOTIVE MUSEUM

Wisconsin's largest auto museum houses more than 110 vehicles, including Studebakers, Kaisers, Fords and the world's largest collection of Kissel automobiles, which were built in Hartford between 1906 and 1931. Exhibits feature gas pumps, signs, license plates, oil cans and other petroliana; outboard engines; and a 1913 Soo Line steam locomotive.









GOLDEN RONDELLE THEATER

Originally designed as the Johnson Wax Pavilion for the 1964-1965 New York World's Fair, the theater now serves as the center for the company's tour program. Includes a 45-minute guided tour of the Frank Lloyd Wright-designed SC Johnson Administration Building. Also the home of the films "Carnauba: A Son's Memoir" and "To Be Alive."

MILWAUKEE COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY

Founded in 1935 and focused on the comprehensive history, culture, people and places of Milwaukee County, it features a collection of artifacts and archival materials. The society shares Milwaukee's stories at distinctive locations listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Offers education programs, exhibitions, a research library and special events.

OLD FALLS VILLAGE MUSEUM

The museum consists of a series of eight buildings that are maintained by the Menomonee Falls Historical Society and furnished with authentic artifacts.

OLD WORLD WISCONSIN

Open-air, interactive history attraction located in southwest Waukesha County. Explore sensory-rich spaces, hear stories from docents in character, and engage in hands-on activities. Features farm and rural life with more than 65 historic buildings, an 1880's village and octagonal Clausing Barn Café. Showcases food preparation methods, historic breeds of animals and heirloom gardens.

RACINE HERITAGE MUSEUM

From astronaut Laurel Clark and architect Frank Lloyd Wright to Case steam tractors and the Underground Railroad, the Heritage Museum of Racine has something for everyone, including a new Racine County Sports Hall of Fame. Free Admission.

TEN CHIMNEYS

The estate lovingly created by theatre legends Alfred Lunt and Lynn Fontanne is a museum and national resource for theatre, arts and arts education.

WAUKESHA COUNTY HISTORICAL SOCIETY & MUSEUM

Located in an 1893 courthouse, the museum features three floors of exhibits, tours, special events, camps for kids and a research center that tell the story of Waukesha County from the time of the Ice Age.

WEST ALLIS HISTORICAL SOCIETY MUSEUM

Housed in an 1887 Richardsonian Romanesque "Cream City" brick building, the museum includes artifacts from an old-time dental clinic, a school room, blacksmith shop, pioneer room, tool room, general store, a cemetery plotted in 1849 and a log-cabin school. Research library contains historical information on West Allis and Town of Greenfield.

BOERNER BOTANICAL GARDENS

A collection of formal garden spaces featuring a variety of plant collections. Formal gardens include the perennial, peony, rock, rose, shrub, annual, daylily, herb and trial gardens. Guided garden tours, classes and special events year-round.

MILWAUKEE COUNTY ZOO

Visit more than 2,100 mammals, birds, fish, amphibians and reptiles representative of 348 different species in specialized habitats spanning 190 wooded acres. Features a zoo train, sea lion show, tram tour, animal rides, dairy farm, restaurants and gift shops. Special events and education programs.

MITCHELL PARK HORTICULTURAL CONSERVATORY - THE DOMES

Three architecturally unique glass domes house a tropical rainforest with a 30-foot waterfall and orchid collection, a desert oasis and a floral "Show Dome" featuring five floral seasonal exhibits.

RACINE ZOO

Nestled on the sandy shores of Lake Michigan, the zoo is home to the world's most remarkable and endangered wildlife. An easy walk for kids and seniors.

SCHLITZ AUDUBON NATURE CENTER

Featuring a 30,000-square-foot "green" building, six miles of hiking trails and a 60-foot observation tower, the center is 15 minutes north of downtown Milwaukee on the shores of Lake Michigan.

URBAN ECOLOGY CENTER

Washington Park: 1859 N. 40th St., Milwaukee; Menomonee Valley: 3700 W. Pierce St., Milwaukee; An environmental education organization with three community centers which provide year-round educational programs for kids, families and adults of all ages.

WEHR NATURE CENTER

Five miles of nature trails loop through 220 acres of woodlands, wetlands, prairie, oak savanna and around 20-acre Mallard Lake. Nature programs for all ages and special seasonal events for families.









Milwaukee, the City of Festivals, holds more festivals than any other city in the United States. There isn't an idle weekend in Milwaukee from Memorial Day through Labor Day. Every week, the metro area hosts at least one major celebration.

SUMMERFEST

Every summer, Milwaukee proudly hosts "The World's Largest Music Festival" on the shores of Lake Michigan. Over its 11-day run at the 75acre Henry W. Maier Festival Park, Summerfest enthralls nearly 900,000 music lovers. It offers a veritable buffet of the music industry's hottest stars, classic icons, emerging talent and local favorites. Among the artists featured this year are: Thomas Rhett, Jason Aldean, Bon Iver, Zac Brown Band, and Ozzy Osbourne with Megadeth, with more acts to be announced in spring. The live music is accompanied by great food and beverages, as well as shopping at four marketplaces.

ETHNIC FESTIVALS

Milwaukee holds more festivals than any other city in the United States. There isn't an idle weekend in Milwaukee from Memorial Day through Labor Day. Every week, the metro area hosts at least one major celebration, including: Festa Italiana, German Fest, Irish Fest, Mexican Fiesta, PrideFest, Indian Summer, and Polish Fest, which are held at the lakeshore Henry W. Maier Festival Park.

Festivals and parades, however, aren't confined to the lakefront. Parade season kicks off in March with the annual St. Patrick's Day parade in Westown Milwaukee. In July, Milwaukeeans celebrate the beginning of the French Revolution at Bastille Days, a downtown block party that is considered to be the largest American celebration of the French Revolution. Greek Fest is an annual celebration held at State Fair Park. In addition, Catholic parishes hold weekend galas throughout the city, while River Rhythms draws hundreds of people to the Milwaukee River in the summer. The annual Kettle Moraine Jazz Festival attracts thousands of jazz lovers to West Bend every September.

Racine's 1,000-slip marina is a focal point of activity throughout the summer. The city's nationally famous fishing contest, Salmon-A-Rama, draws participants from around the country in July.

The Wisconsin State Fair is the premier family fun event of the summer, featuring something for everyone. The fair is held each August at State Fair Park in West Allis and is the area's largest event, attracting close to 910,000 people over 11 days.

Summer doesn't have a monopoly on area activities. The Milwaukee Film Festival brings internationally acclaimed films to local theaters in the fall. The annual Holiday Folk Fair International, the nation's oldest and largest indoor ethnic festival, is held around Thanksgiving each year at the Wisconsin Exposition Center at State Fair Park.

Racine is noted for its lavish Christmas displays and holiday parades. You'll want to check out "Christmas House," which consists of two turnof-the-century mansions bathed in more than 200,000 lights. The Festival of Trees features 30 professionally decorated Christmas trees, wreaths and gingerbread houses. Then there is the outdoor ice skating at Red Arrow Park in downtown Milwaukee, where you can enjoy coffee or hot chocolate while you glide away in the city's theater district.









A MAJOR LEAGUE CITY

When it comes to sports, Milwaukee is definitely in the major leagues with two professional sports teams – the NBA's exciting Milwaukee Bucks, which competes in Fiserv Forum, their new, best-in-class arena; and the Milwaukee Brewers professional baseball team, which offers one of the best tailgating experiences in professional sports at Miller Park, a few miles west of Downtown Milwaukee. A third professional team – the NFL's Green Bay Packers – isn't technically located in the region, but it has very strong ties to the region, having played three games a year here from 1953 to 1994 and many residents still have season tickets (plus their home field is only two hours away). Milwaukee is also home to the Milwaukee Admirals professional hockey team and the Milwaukee Wave professional soccer team.

Milwaukee is a great college town as well, featuring two Division 1 NCAA basketball teams – the legendary Marquette Golden Eagles, which play in the Big East Conference; and the University of Wisconsin - Milwaukee Panthers, which play in the Horizon League.

Cedarburg Walking & Bike Trails

One of the best ways to take in all the natural beauty and explore nature in Cedarburg is to bike or hike one of our amazing nature trails. They are great for those that are into a more rigorous ride, or those that prefer sightseeing and enjoying biking at a more leisurely pace.

Ozaukee Interurban Trail

The Ozaukee Interurban is a 30-mile paved trail that spans the entire length of Ozaukee County. The majority of the Trail is off-road and perfect for family enjoyment. The Trail connects the Ozaukee communities of Mequon, Thiensville, Cedarburg, Grafton, Port Washington and Belgium. It runs along woodlands, wetlands, farmlands and waterways, including the Milwaukee River, Lake Michigan and the Lake Michigan National Marine Sanctuary, and provides easy access to Ozaukee County's walkable downtowns.











Bugline Recreational Trail

This 16 mile asphalt multiuse trail was built in 1983 on the former Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul, and Pacific Railroad right-of-way. The trail is eight feet wide and extends from Menomonee Falls west to the Village of Merton. This trail connects Village neighborhoods to Menomonee County Park.

ion's Den Trail

Lion's Den Trail is a 2.1 mile heavily trafficked loop trail located near Grafton, Wisconsin that features a lake and is good for all skill levels. The trail is primarily used for hiking, walking, and running and is best used from April until October. Dogs are also able to use this trail but must be kept on leash.





Covered Bridge Trail

Covered Bridge Trail is a 0.4 mile lightly trafficked loop trail located near Cedarburg, Wisconsin that features a river and is good for all skill levels. The trail is primarily used for walking, running, nature trips, and fishing. Dogs are also able to use this trail but must be kept on leash.

Cedar Creek Walkway

While enjoying the many shops and eateries in Cedarburg take some time to enjoy the walk along the river. Cedar Creek Walkway is approximately a mile-long beautifully paved walkway along the banks of Cedar Creek. Park benches and picnic areas provide locations of respite for those taking in the beauty provided by Cedar Creek.



Pleasant Valley Trail

Pleasant Valley Trails Mountain Bike Loop is a 4.2 mile lightly trafficked loop trail located near Grafton, Wisconsin that offers the chance to see wildlife and is rated as moderate. The trail is primarily used for hiking, nature trips, and mountain biking and is best used from May until October.

Bratt Woods Trail

Located along the Milwaukee River in the Town of Grafton, Bratt Woods is 17 acres. In addition to bordering the Milwaukee River this preserve contains mature oak, maple, and American beech trees all in gorgeous upland hardwood forests. The forest and the river benefit the migrating birds that need a place to rest. Eventually, the hope is that Bratt Woods will revert back to its original mature beech and maple forest character. To accomplish this, OWLT staff and volunteers removed and continue to remove invasive species, built and now maintain trails and generally oversee that the preserve is "public ready." Visit this preserve to hike, bird watch, fish or cross country ski. Pets on leash welcome.





Mequon Walking & Bike Trails

Beautiful Mequon is home to great hiking trails, biking trails, running trails and more. Enjoy easy hiking trails in Mequon Nature Preserve that are great for the whole family. Mequon has trails ranging from 6 to 121 feet in elevation for the experienced cyclist. Whatever you have planned for the day, you can find the perfect trail in Mequon.

Garrison's Glen Trail

Garrison's Glen Trail is a 0.5 mile lightly trafficked loop trail located near Mequon, Wisconsin that features beautiful wild flowers and is good for all skill levels. The trail is primarily used for walking and nature trips.



Grasslyn Nature Preserve Trail

Nestled in a residential area, Grasslyn is a respite from the hectic world we live in. Featuring both woodland and prairie, the trails traverse a small boardwalk, and meander around the prairie and through the woods. Birds sing from the treetops, and nesting boxes are home to Swallows. There are a few comfy benches that encourage you to sit a spell, revel in the sounds around you, and just, well, relax.

Highland Woods Trail

Highland Woods Trail is a 1.1 mile lightly trafficked loop trail located near Mequon, Wisconsin that features beautiful wild flowers and is good for all skill levels. The trail is primarily used for hiking, walking, and nature trips.





line Kiln Park Trail

Just like you are walking through the Wisconsin Dells, but right here in Menomonee Falls! Park right behind Main Street, and you can go on trails on either side of the river, or you can get your rain boots on and go through the river and see these bluffs with your own eyes up close. There are 3 waterfalls here, mostly under 5 ft high, see if you can find them all!



Swan Road to Observation Tower Loop is a 1.4 mile moderately trafficked loop trail located near Mequon, Wisconsin that offers the chance to see wildlife and is good for all skill levels. The trail is primarily used for walking, nature trips, and bird watching and is accessible year-round. Dogs are also able to use this trail but must be kept on leash.



Lake at Menomonee Park

Hiking around this lake at all times of the year is fun. You can park by the beach on any side of the lake and you are greeted with breathtaking views of Menomonee Park's pond, or "Lannon Quarry" as others have called it. It will take you about 30 minutes to hike the whole thing if you are exploring the entire lake, see my photos for a map of the lake. Make sure you walk all the way out onto the Peninsula on the north side of the lake for a great view of the surrounding water and beach!

Mequon Preserves Trail

Mequon Preserve Trail is a 0.5 mile moderately trafficked loop trail located near Mequon, Wisconsin that offers the chance to see wildlife and is good for all skill levels. The trail offers a number of activity options and is accessible year-round. Dogs are also able to use this trail but must be kept on leash.
